How Does Traralgon Lions Spend The Money?

As a stallholder paying stall fees, you may well ask the above question.

Firstly, all requests for donations go through an approval process by the club members to ensure we are spending wisely and generously. Some examples of our spending is as follows.

Within the last year Traralgon Lions have provided a 21st birthday party for a terminally girl, and funding for a local lady with Lyme's Disease enabling her to travel to Germany for specialist treatment.

In recent times we have provided \$1.000 for "Need for Feed" to provide fodder for fire and drought affected farmers. and \$5,000 to support the needs of communities affected by bushfires in Western Australia, South Australia and Victoria.

The devastation to Fiji caused by Cyclone Winston was another humanitarian cause to which we donated \$5,000. We have supported local Girl Guides by providing funding for the update of their kitchen. Traralgon Band and the local Air Cadet squadron are
